It has become an annual tradition to celebrate “Art of the Spirit” in December at O’Hanlon, and we invite artists to submit work for our next exhibit. Submitted work should relate to some aspect of Spiritual Life, including spiritual ecology, ritual, mysticism or other forms of spiritual expression. We encourage artists to express from their own personal experience of ‘spirit’ in their lives.

Contemporary, expressionistic, abstract, exploratory, and/or experimental entries encouraged.
 O’Hanlon Center for the Arts emphasizes the creative process and the continued pursuit of meaning and authenticity through observation, exploration, and experimentation.

MEDIA: All Media

- Open to all artists age 16 and over.
- Submission limit: 3 works per artist.
- Please do not submit works previously displayed in the O’Hanlon Gallery.

ART PREPARATION

- **All work** must be ready for display.
- **Wall hung pieces** must be **securely wired**.
- **Label all work** with **Artist’s name, Telephone, Medium, Size & Price**, if for sale.
- Bring **resume** and/or **artist statement**, if desired. (2 pages max.)

About the Juror

Patsy Krebs

A native of northern California, Patsy Krebs spent her formative years as an artist in New York. She later lived in Los Angeles, where she earned an MFA from Claremont College in 1976 and began an exhibiting career. She has taught extensively at art institutions throughout California, most recently at Dominican University, San Rafael. She presently divides her time between northern California and southern Colorado.

In 1996 and 2010, Krebs was awarded a Pollack-Krasner Foundation Artist's Grant. Her work is featured in the collections of the Norton Museum, West Palm Beach, FL; Denver Art Museum, CO; San Francisco Museum of Modern Art, CA; Berkeley Art Museum/Pacific Film Archive, CA; and the de Young Museum, San Francisco, CA. She has been featured in publications and newspapers such as Art in America, ART news, the San Francisco Chronicle and Los Angeles Times. *Patsy Krebs: Painting*, a new monographic survey of Krebs' work, was published in 2017.
